

SMBRC Governing Board Meeting Minutes

June 15, 2017

Welcome and Introductions

At 9:41 Enrique Zaldivar called the meeting to order. Introductions followed.

1) Comments from Members of the Public on Items Not on the Agenda and Public Testimony on All Agenda Items

Public Comment:

Marcia Hanscom, Ballona Institute and Sierra Club, thanked Mike Bonin regarding a road safety project in Playa del Rey. Hanscom also commented that there is an over emphasis of board members on water which to her means that the Commission and Foundation need to get out of Ballona wetlands which was acquired to protect the wildlife.

Kathy Knight, Ballona Ecosystem Education Project, made public comment regarding the Ballona EIR and the need for a fresh water wetland alternative in it, not a saltwater wetland. Knight also commented on opening up Ballona Creek from its starting point in Griffith Park. Knight commented on her trip to the Galapagos Islands and their respect for the wildlife and ecosystems and how that reinforced her vision for the Ballona Ecological Reserve to have it restored ecologically to what it was with just a few small paths for people.

Jeanette Vosburg made public comment regarding an EIR freshwater alternative for the Ballona Wetlands Ecological Reserve. Vosburg's printed public comment was passed around.

Jim Lamm, Ballona Creek Renaissance (BCR), made public comment regarding BCR and highlights from their organization. Lamm commented on three highlights included an up creek art event at LA Collage, a creek cleanup and habitat restoration along Ballona Creek, and the Culver City single use polystyrene food container ban. Brief discussion followed regarding the Culver City single use polystyrene food container ban.

2) Informational Items

a. Order of Agenda.

The order of the agenda was not changed.

b. Reports from the Chair

Enrique Zaldivar gave the chair report. Zaldivar reported the Executive Committee's work on transition due to resignation of the Executive Director.

c. Reports from the Technical Advisory Committee

Guangyu Wang gave the TAC report. Wang reported that the TAC has not met since the last meeting but will meet on June 29th. Wang reported the TAC continues to work on the update of the Comprehensive Monitoring Program and a request from LA County Sanitation and USC Sea Grant for membership to the TAC.

d. Reports from the Executive Director (ED) and Staff

Tom Ford gave the ED report. Ford reported the NEPs are still allocated full funding for the time being. Ford reported on the estuary caucus formed in D.C. Ford reported on the transition of the NEP program officer from Molly Martin to Erica Yelensky. Ford reported on the LMU internship program, UCLA Institute of the Environment senior practicum work to monitor kelps impact on climate change, and UCLA senior honors colloquium course to move the Climate Change Vulnerability Assessment to action planning. For also reported on Stone Canyon Creek restoration on UCLA campus.

Ford reported on the Clean Bay Certified Table to Farm program in the City of Inglewood to compost food scraps and be used to grow Community Supported Agriculture. Ford reported on the LA County Department of Water and Power grant to educate middle school students regarding water and energy. Ford reported on Los Alamitos Park treating waste water for irrigation and changing public health code requirements to get this done. Ford reported Cal Poly Pomona work to culture green abalone and a red abalone. Ford reported there is a new Pumpout Nav. app for boaters to find places to discharge sewage. Ford reported on the Clean Bay Certified Restaurant Program and a card to promote the program at restaurants. Ford reported on the kelp forest restoration project, kelp is up 250% in restoration sites. Ford reported the aerial surveys monitoring report is available on santamonicabay.org. Ford reported on the Ballona iceplant removal project and the LAX dune restoration project. Ford reported the Santa Monica Patagonia store employees are contributing to the LAX dune restoration project. Ford reported Malibu Lagoon year 4 comprehensive monitoring report is being finalized and year 5 will be beginning soon. Ford reported at the Santa Monica Beach dune restoration pilot project plants are flowering and the threatened western snowy plover nested in the site.

Discussion followed

Public Comment: Jeanette Vosburg made public comment regarding the iceplant removal acreage and invasive plants growing in place of the iceplant that was removed.

Marsh Hanscom made public comment regarding the iceplant removal project occurring when the rare skipper butterfly was breeding.

Tom Ford presented the BRP revisions and SMBNEP processes.

Discussion followed. Johnathan Bishop requested the presentation be sent to members as a reminder to review. Charlie Caspary requested board members be reminded of WAC meetings when they occur and encouraged board members to attend these meetings. Sam Ziegler suggested the EPA give the board members their expectations and requirements of the revised BRP at the next meeting. Zaldivar suggested discussion at the EC meeting on how to form subcommittees.

3) Governing Board Business

a. Consideration of Approval of April 20, 2017 Meeting Minutes

b. Consideration of Amendment to the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the Santa Monica Bay Restoration Commission and The Bay Foundation regarding the Santa Monica Bay National Estuary Program (As amended June 18, 2015)

Ford introduced this item and went through the proposed changes to the MOA. Jonathan Bishop noted the State Water Board will continue to support the commission and this change to the MOA. Jonathan Bishop also announced that Guangyu Wang will serve as Chief Administrative Director of the SMBRC after June 29, 2017. Shahram Kharaghani presented the City of Los Angeles Ballona Creek Bacteria TMDL project. Discussion followed.

Public Comment: Marcia Hanscom made public comment regarding bacterial TMDL adjustments for wildlife background levels. Hanscom made comments regarding Malibu Lagoon restoration project.

Jonathan Bishop responded to Hanscom's TMDL comment.

Bob Godfrey reported on the youth fishing and youth sailing programs as well as the seabass pen. Philip Fries announced he will be retiring so this is his last meeting and Martha Tremblay will take his seat on the Commission board. Jefferson Wagner announced the City of Malibu advanced a ban on plastic sand bags and is moving forward on a plastic ban for food trucks in the City.
