

SMBRC Governing Board Meeting Minutes

October 19, 2017

Welcome and Introductions

At 9:46 Enrique Zaldivar called the meeting to order. Introductions followed.

1) Comments from Members of the Public on Items Not on the Agenda and Public Testimony on All Agenda Items

Public Comment:

Don Michael provided public comment regarding Malibu drainage area and 2008 Bay Restoration Plan. Don Michael left a geological report for board members on the Malibu drainage area.

Suzy Goodman, Sierra Club Airport Marina group, requested a 120-day extension on the Ballona Wetlands Restoration Project EIR.

Kathy Knight, Ballona Ecosystem Education Project, requested assistance asking for a 120-day extension to comment on the Ballona Wetlands Restoration Project EIR. Knight noted others who are requesting an extension to the EIR. Knight also asked for support to study a seasonal freshwater wetland restoration project alternative. Knight commented on work to daylight the Ballona Creek.

Walter Lamb, Ballona Wetland Land Trust, commented on the Ballona Wetlands Restoration Project draft EIR/EIS.

2) Informational Items

a. Order of Agenda.

The order of the agenda was not changed.

b. Reports from the Chair

Enrique Zaldivar gave the Chair report. Zaldivar reported on the Executive Committee (EC) meeting including preparation of agenda for this board meeting, especially the planning of the Bay Restoration Plan (BRP) revision workshop. Zaldivar also reported on the discussion at the EC meeting regarding the review of the Ballona Wetlands Restoration Project EIR/EIS and the problem of the limited capacity of the Commission and the Governing Board to make official comment regarding the EIR/EIS. Discussion followed. The governing board provided direction to the Chief Administrative Director to consider the appropriateness of asking for an extension to the existing deadline of the EIR and EIS, and to agendaize an item at the next GB meeting to consider the issue of whether an additional extension may be appropriate depending on what happens between now and Nov. 24. The governing board also provided direction to the Chief Administrative Director to consider agendaizing a presentation from the State Department of Fish and Wildlife regarding the EIR/EIS and/or discussion of other issues related to the EIR/EIS at the next Governing Board meeting.

c. Reports from the Technical Advisory Committee

Steve Bay gave the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) report. Bay reported that the TAC has had no meeting since the last governing board meeting in June. Bay reported that Phyllis Grifman has been officially welcomed and added as a TAC member and the next meeting is scheduled for November 28th.

d. Reports from the Chief Administrative Director and SMBNEP staff

Guangyu Wang gave the Chief Administrative Director report. Wang reported on the pH sensor project and the planned change in location of deployment to enabling gathering data associated with upwelling

events. Wang also reported on the status of the Prop 84 projects recommended for funding by the Commission to the State Water Resources Control Board and noted that recommendation for reallocation of funding involving two of the projects will be brought to the Board for consideration at the next meeting. Wang also noted that the December board meeting will include elections of board members, chair, and vice chairs. Wang also commented on the WAC meeting which was cancelled and rescheduled for Nov. 8.

Tom Ford gave the SMBNEP staff report. Ford reported on the When Nature Calls publication being used as a template for a national publication. Ford also reported on the progress of the Pumpout Nav. app. Ford reported on the continuation of the kelp restoration project and kelp hydrodynamics study. Ford reported the Malibu Lagoon fourth year post-restoration monitoring report is out and year five data collection has started. Ford reported on the Ballona Wetlands iceplant removal project. Ford reported the Ballona Creek Restoration Project EIR/EIS public meeting is Nov 8th at 6:00pm at Burton Chace Park. Ford reported on the work to revise the Bay Restoration Plan.
